👒 Uniform Expectations

At THPS, we take great pride in being part of our school community — and an important part of showing that pride is wearing our school uniform correctly every day.

Overall, our students do a wonderful job of wearing the correct uniform, but there are a few key details we'd like to highlight to ensure everyone is meeting expectations.

👒 HATS:

School hats are compulsory while outside — it's "No hat, no play!"

Students without a hat will need to sit in the shade near Room 2 and the Science Space. Please remember that carrying your hat in your hand or turning up the sides won't protect you from the sun, so always wear your hat correctly.

🕒 JEWELLERY:

We've noticed a little more jewellery appearing lately. Please remember that the only jewellery permitted at school is:

- Simple studs or small sleepers for earrings
- A simple watch

That's it!

This means no necklaces, bracelets, friendship bands, or rings, and also no makeup or nail polish. We've seen a few students wearing mascara and nail polish recently — please save these for weekends or after school.

👩 HAIR:

If your hair is long enough to tie up, it must be pulled back — into a ponytail, braids, a bun, or pigtails. A headband or half-up style isn't enough; hair needs to be fully tied back at all times.

These expectations apply to every student, every day and reflects our THPS value of integrity. Our uniform policy helps keep everyone safe and healthy, brings us together as a team, and allows us all to focus on learning.

This information helps us plan for class placements, staffing, and resources for the year ahead.



